

What does it mean to **EXPUNGE** my juvenile record?

To "erase" or physically destroy records or to return the records to you, and to obliterate (remove) your name from any official index or public record, making the record off limits to most entities.

NOT ALL JUVENILE RECORDS JUST GO AWAY!

A study from the Illinois Juvenile Justice Commission found that less than one percent of cases eligible for expungement were expunged in the state of Illinois.

Why is expunging my juvenile record **IMPORTANT**?

- Can impact ability to get a job, attend college, or serve in the military
- Confidentiality is not always a guarantee with juvenile records

DO I NEED A LAWYER TO FILE FOR JUVENILE EXPUNGEMENT?

No, you can file your juvenile expungement petition on your own without an attorney; however, you can hire one if you wish to do so. You may also wish to consult with a lawyer if you are not a United States citizen.
