**DISCUSSION:**

- **Question: What is the status for an event at the south end?**
  - **Has been opened up to all districts in Kane County**



- Can work with representatives from East and West Aurora to see if they are interested in hosting
- Reiterated that registration for the two events in January is open countywide
  - Overflow plans for both schools
  - Current registration through Geneva is 150

- Mental Health Parent Handout  
**Planning to put together a basic parent handout about trauma/mental health/social emotional issues**
  - **If you would like to be involved in creating something, let Julia and Sarah know**

#### 7. Subcommittee Updates

- Restorative Practices
  - **Survey distributed to the school districts to assess where they are in the implementation of restorative practices**
  - **Using the information to help inform the work of the committee**
  - **Also planning an opportunity to facilitate discussion in person among the school districts**
    - **Will help identify where the JJC can help support the expansion of the framework**
- Data Collection
  - **Juvenile Court Act restricts the release of information due to confidentiality**
    - **There is a caveat that allows research with approval from the judiciary and the Chief law enforcement officer of an agency**
  - **The subcommittee has been working on a proposal to request more formalized support in getting the arrest data**
    - **Will first review with Judge Abrahamson and then submit to Chief Judge Boles as a request for a General Order**
    - **Once the plan is complete, the requests will be extended to law enforcement agencies**

#### 8. Legislative Updates

##### **Public Act 100-1142: New Transportation Safety Hazard Expanded**

**Provides that each school board may provide free transportation for any pupil residing within 1 1/2 miles from the school attended where conditions are such that walking, either to or from the school to which a pupil is assigned for attendance or to or from a pick-up point or bus stop, constitutes a serious hazard to the safety of the pupil due to a course or pattern of criminal activity, as defined in the Illinois Streetgang Terrorism Omnibus Prevention Act. Provides for the adoption of guidelines by the local law enforcement agency as to what constitutes a serious safety hazard due to a course or pattern of criminal activity.**

##### **Federal – HR 6964**

**Reauthorizes the Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Act (JJDP)**

#### 9. Other updates

- **Sheriff Hain shared updates at the Sheriff's Department**
  - **Signed a contract with Rich Wistocki**
    - **Knowledgeable about cybercrime; will do training/presentations**



- Also working on software for juvenile arrest data
- New partnership with FSA
  - FSA is sending 4 staff members, including MHJJ Liaison
  - Will allow them to respond to crises in Saint Charles sooner
- Junaid Afeef also did Internet Safety presentation in partnership with the JJC if anyone is interested
