Free training program – community education with basic First Aid and trauma care

- **Early intervention to stop the bleeds. Different from *Stop the Bleed* program because it focuses on more than how to use a tourniquet**
- **Includes components that discuss how to take care of those who are helping others deal with trauma**
 - **Participants provided with a card and phone number that they can call to connect them with the TRUE Communities program**
- **Prefer adults, minimum 20 participants per class and up to 40, 3-4 hour course**
 - Kane County Health Department Initiatives, Michael Isaacson

Provided overview of Children's Mental Health Grant

- **Collaboration with Kane County Behavioral Health Council, JJC, All Our Kids (AOK) Network, ROE, and service providers from the community**
 - **Includes strategies to be more data informed, involve youth and families, and coordinate care**
 - **Plans to identify youth as soon as possible, make it easier to navigate the system and meet all needs of families**

Provided overview of services

- **Closest location is Saint Charles – outpatient program**
- **Mental Health and Substance Use provider**
- **5 different levels of care:**
 - **Inpatient → Partial Hospitalization → Intensive Outpatient**
 - **Includes individual and group therapy, meet with a psychiatrist**
 - **Linden Oaks Medical Group has therapists and doctors**
- **90 minute free assessments available**
 - **Can call ahead and schedule or can do a walk-in at the Naperville location**
 - **Will refer out if not eligible for services – do not accept Medicaid**
- **Tutoring provided daily by a teacher, also school liaison to help with transitions back to school**
- **Adolescents – 12 and up**
- **After assessment is complete, will be provided with an after care summary with recommendations**

- **FY starts in July**

HB 2084 – Amends school code. Makes changes with respect to school discipline improvement plans; establishes the Safe Schools and Healthy Learning Environments grant

SB 2021 – Creates Medicaid Eligibility Determination and Renewal Reform Act

SB1633/HB2572 – Children and Young Adult Mental Health Crisis Act; requires Dept of Healthcare and Family Services to restructure Family Support Program



HB 2486: Mental Health Modernization Act

HB 2485: Autism Coverage under Medicaid

SB27: Insurance Coverage for Telehealth Services

SB 1735: School Mental Health Awareness; in-service training program on warning signs of mental illness and suicidal behavior in youth

HB2235 – Permits retired police officers to attend school resource officer training

- Other updates

Kane County Bar Association voted to provide \$750 for student award; also received an anonymous donation for \$250 – scholarship will total \$1000

Kim Svevo mentioned Best Start for Families – Health Equity Approach facilitator training – May 3rd, 4th, and 11th
